Project:

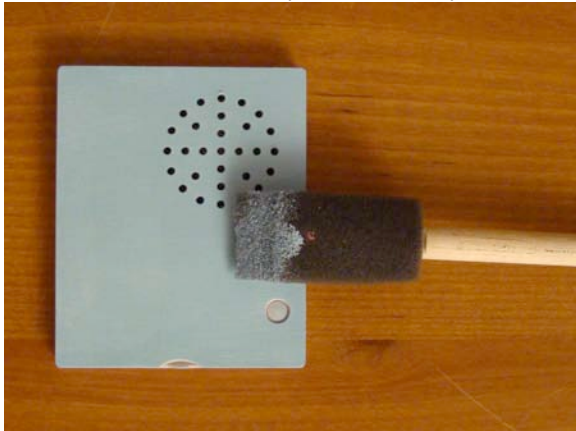
A gift that SAYS it all! This unique card not only talks/sings to the recipient it also houses pictures, words and a gift card! You can use this same technique for many different occasions. We have demonstrated a Birthday Card. This gift would also work great for a baby shower or wedding gift, OR Christmas, Valentines or Anniversary card.

Step-By-Step Instructions:

1. Record your message on your My Pages Talk 30 second voice recorder (instructions come with the recorder), disable the "enable/disable" switch.



2. Paint the recorder's acid free paper cover with acrylic paint. It is best to start at the end opposite of the speaker so that your brush is fairly dry when you paint over the speaker holes. Lightly sand edges.



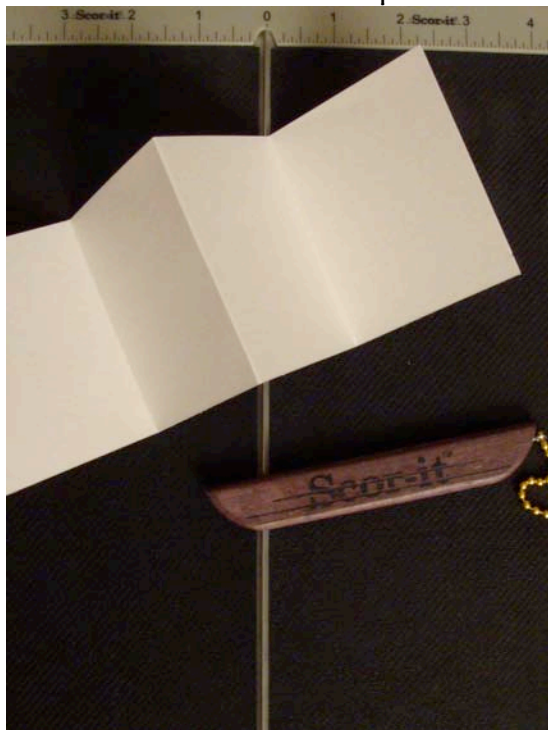
3. Fold the large "Celebrate" tag from the "Birthday Wishes Tags" in half. Then using the Bordeaux Ink stamp the Calendar stamp on the tag. You can circle the month and day of the Birthday you are celebrating.



4. Using your finger nail or a popsicle stick rub through the tag where the play button should be, this will leave an imprint that you can use as a guide to punch your _" hole.
5. Apply candle rub-ons to the top edge of the voice recorder.
6. Adhere the Calendar tag; add ribbon and a flower with a brad. The ribbon can be taped to the backside of the recorder.



7. Cut a strip of white cardstock to 3 3/8" x 12". Using your scor-it make a scor every 2 _". There will be a small amount of excess to trim off the end. You should end up with 4 sections. For thicker cards repeat this step and adhere your strips together.



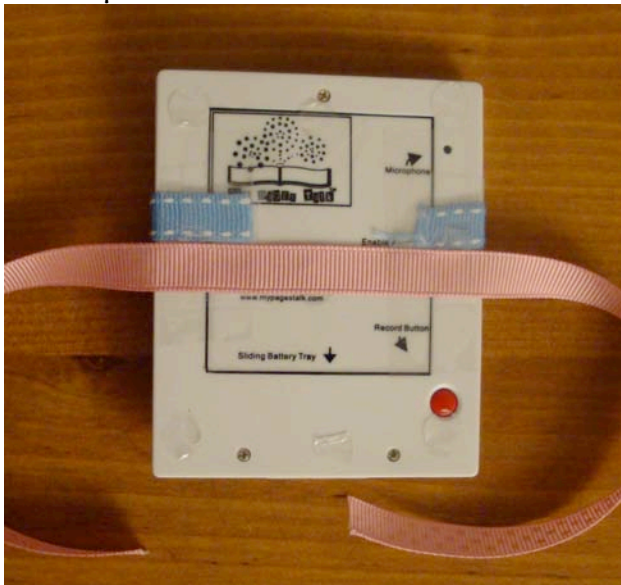
8. Ink all edges of the white cardstock and fold like an accordian.
9. Decorate all sections (both sides) as desired. You can use photos, papers, rub-ons, stickers, stamps etc. You will decorate all sections except for one side of one square that will adhere to the backside of the voice recorder.



10. For one of the sections create a pocket to hold the GIFT CARD. Do this by adhering the paper at the bottom and two sides only; this will leave an opening at the top for your gift card to slide into.



11. Cut a strip of ribbon to about 12" adhere it to the center back of the voice recorder.



12. Last, use a strong adhesive to adhere your blank square of your accordion card. Fold the card and tie the ribbon to hold it closed.
